## 2. Summary of Status:

With support from the African Elephant Fund Space for Giants was able to successfully deliver all project deliverables and achieve the outcome that we envisioned by the end of June 2021. The work has transformed food security and conflict in Laikipia and has resulted in improved coexistence in a time when Covid has put severe pressure on local communities. Our data (no. of crop raids) indicates that crop raiding has reduced significantly - by over 70% since the completion of the Mathira fence (informal focus group discussions with local chiefs and key stakeholders indicate a 60 - 80% reduction based on perception). In total we were able to relocate 72 elephants to the correct side of the fence (of which at least 20 individuals were known crop raiding bulls) and our 3 elephant collars (along with camera trap data) have provided invaluable data on how elephants continue to try to find weaknesses in fence alignments. We realise that many benefits of this project will only be felt further down the line (e.g. changing attitudes and perceptions of elephants, land values, tree growth regeneration etc.) however in the immediate term this project has helped relieve unsustainable levels of conflict and we are confident that this is an excellent foundation to continue building on.


